During the 1920s, an Americanization movement took hold to teach the language, customs, laws, and ideals of America to immigrants. Friendly House's origins emerged from both the Americanization and ongoing influence of the "Settlement House" movements of the late 1880s (London, Chicago), where social reformers established houses in neighborhoods to provide education and social services directly to poor workers and immigrant populations who lived there.

Now approaching a century as a charitable organization, Friendly House has evolved to address multiple social service needs in the community. For decades, the organization has remained true to the meaning of its mission – To empower Arizona communities through education and human services.

Today, Friendly House offers programs in Early Childhood Development, K-8 Charter School, Youth Education Services, Family Services, Workforce Development, Adult Education and Immigration and Citizenship Services.

With recognition from community, city and state partner agencies as a high-performing organization, Friendly House has become a local institution, rich in history, providing trusted and quality services.







ACADEMIA DEL PUEBLO ELEMENTARY

Kindergarten - Eighth Grade

Academia del Pueblo (ADP) is a kindergarten through 8th grade charter school part of Friendly House. ADP offers a comprehensive elementary school curriculum that employs high academic standards and strategic curriculum interventions designed to meet and excel Arizona College and Career Readiness State Standards. Our highly qualified teachers create innovative lesson plans to challenge and inspire students to become global thinkers and community leaders.







Early Childhood Development Center

The Early Childhood Development Center (ECDC), a Quality First participating center, is designed to be a child's home away from home. ADULT EDUCATION

The Adult Education program gives access to quality educational opportunities to support employment, job training and higher education aspirations. By assisting adult learners to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for effective participation in society, Friendly House creates an exceptional future for Arizona, where citizens transform their lives and realize their full potential through our services.

GED Preparation Classes

Our Program offers integrated instruction in the five subjects covered on the GED exam. Individuals interested in classes must attend a three-day registration process and meet certain requirements.

ELT for Refugee*

English Language Training (ELT) has been contracted by the Department of Economic Security (DES) to provide integrated skills instruction to adult refugees, asylees, and Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) holders who have lived less than five years in the U.S. Individuals in these classes learn contextualized language skills and information about using technology for language learning is provided.

English Classes (ELAA)

This program offers English classes from basic to high intermediate levels. The goal of the program is to provide English Language learning as well as support for transitioning students into higher education or the job market. The program integrates the four components of English learning.

I-BEST

Students are enrolled in a GED class and concurrently enrolled in a community college course. This is a very fast paced and demanding pathway, that guarantees their GED and community college credential at the completion of the program. Students are then able to enter the workforce in a career that pays a living wage.

YOUTH SERVICES

The Educational Talent Search (ETS) program is a federally funded program through the Department of Education. ETS targets 550 primarily low income and first generation potential college students from middle schools, charter schools, and high schools in the Phoenix area. The goal of Talent Search is to increase the number of youths from disadvantaged backgrounds who complete high school and enroll in postsecondary education institutions of their choice. The program provides academic, career, and financial counseling to its participants depending on their academic needs.

WORKFORCE

Friendly House's Workforce Development Program empowers individuals and families in the community to become self-sufficient through education, job placement, and occupational training. The overall objectives of the Workforce Development Department include: To provide a seamless workforce development system that meets the individual needs of each eligible individual enrolled in the program. To meet the workforce needs of high demand/targeted industries in the greater Phoenix area as well as other businesses in need of qualified and skilled employees.



APS Lineworker Program

Friendly House will be providing support to scholarship recipients throughout their program by providing case management services to ensure that they are successful during the school year and are prepared potential candidates for a Lineworker career. Friendly House will guide participants through any academic processes, coordinate for all to obtain their CDL, have all students CPR certified, and provide any necessary supportive services that will assist with promoting their success.

Reentry for Young Adults

The RISE UP program is focused on providing opportunities for young adults, 18-24 years old, who have had contact or are currently involved with the criminal justice system. Individuals involved in the program will be provided with financial literacy, restoration of rights, soft skill, social skill workshops, and other necessary guidance. All participants will also have the option of participating in transitional employment in which they will be working with partner employers to learn about possible career opportunities. During this transition period participants will be prepared to enter the workforce or obtain training to become better employment candidates.
